



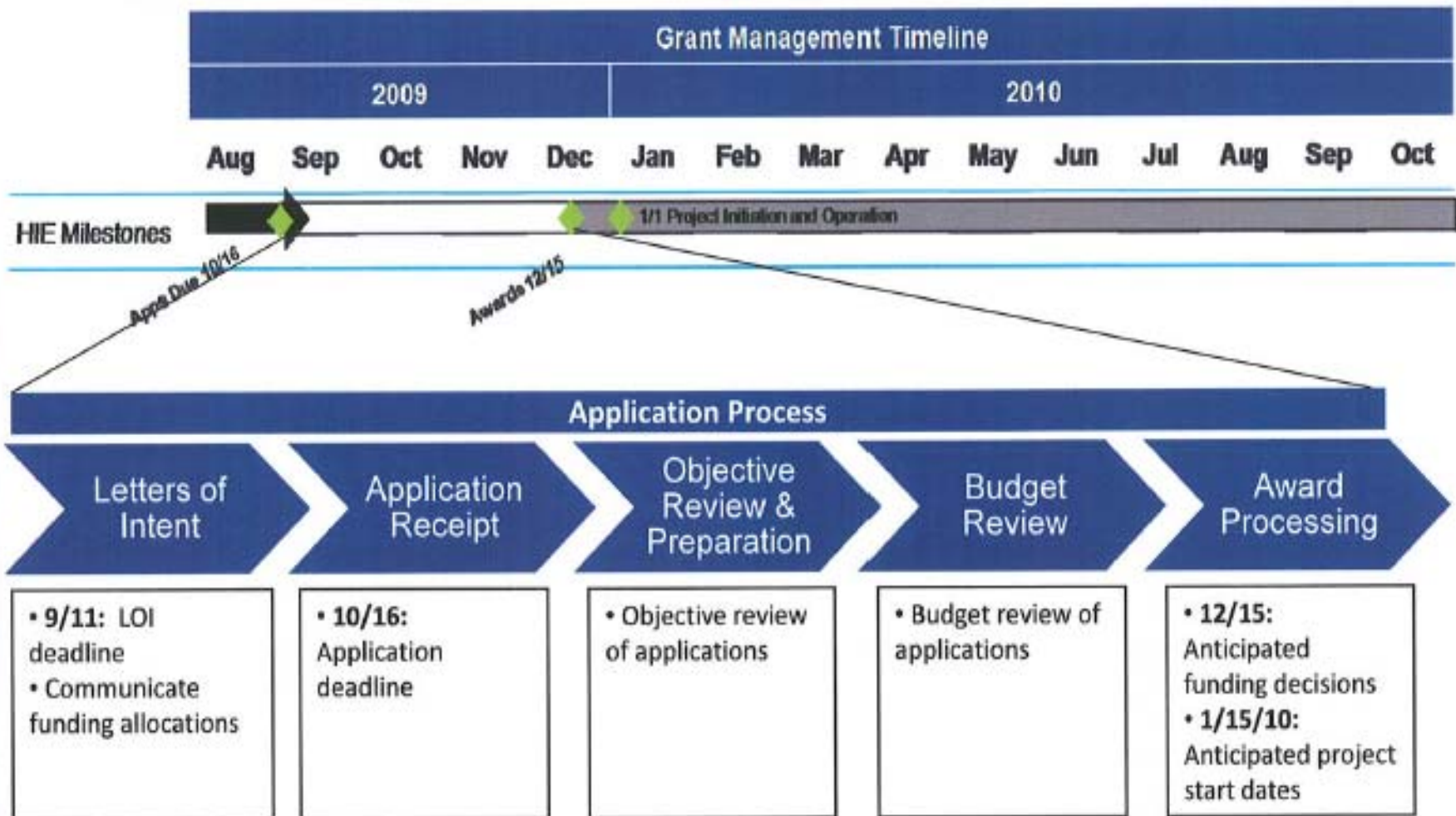

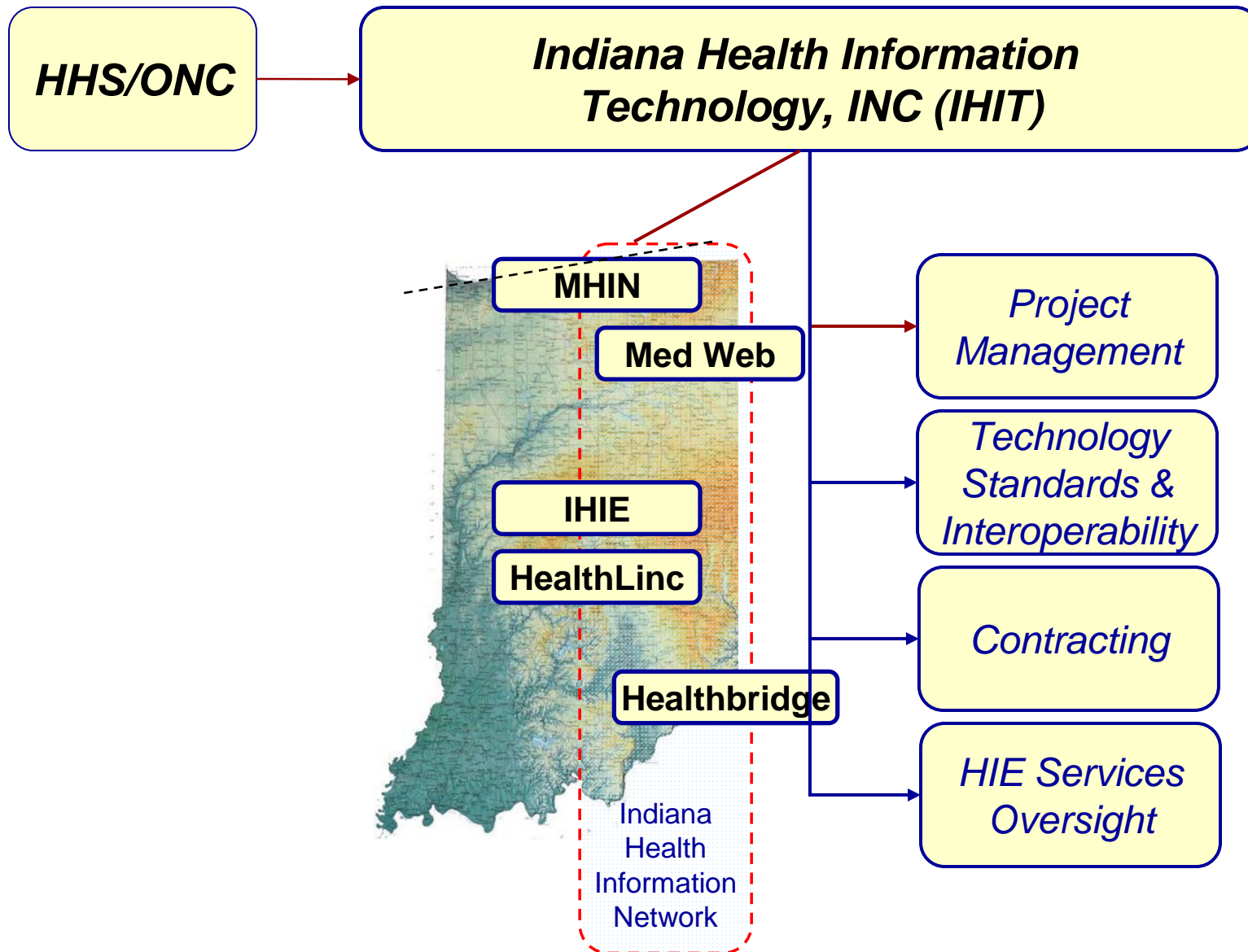
# Indiana ARRA HITECH Funding Preparation

- Program Overview: **SHIE-CAP**
  - Purpose: Fund the creation and expansion of HIE infrastructure to give providers a means of meeting “meaningful use”
  - Total program funding (nationwide): \$564 Million
  - Lead organizations : Indiana Health Informatics Corporation (IHIC) and BioCrossroads
  
- Program Overview: **HIT Extension Program**
  - Purpose: Fund creation of organizations that deliver technical support to small/medium sized physician practices in implementing EMRs and meeting “meaningful use” definition(s)
  - Total program funding (nationwide): \$598 Million
  - Lead organizations in Indiana: Purdue University (Regenstrief Center for Healthcare Engineering)
  
- Designed to be executed prior to 2011 provider incentives to help make “meaningful use” definition(s) achievable
- Other future “funding buckets” are to be announced

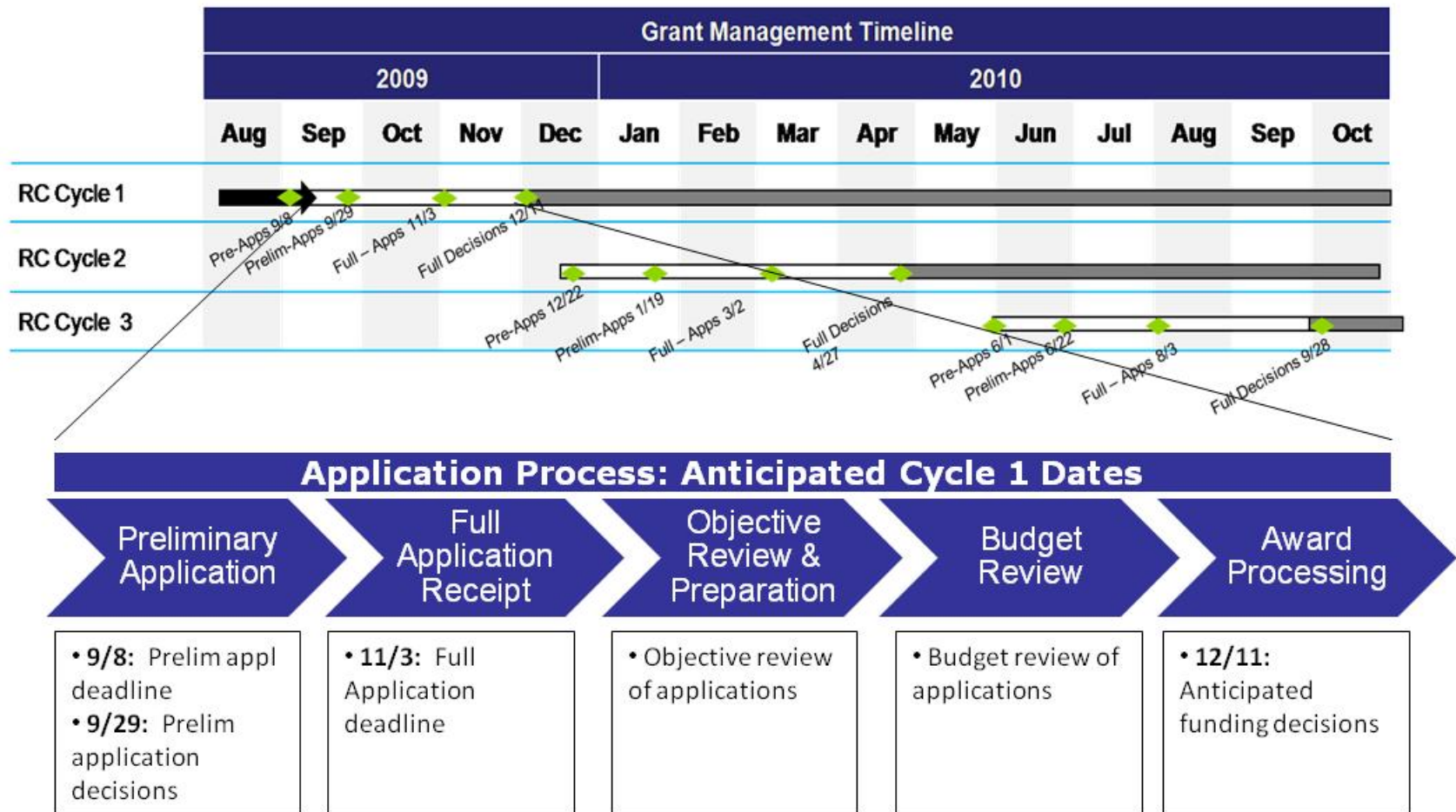
