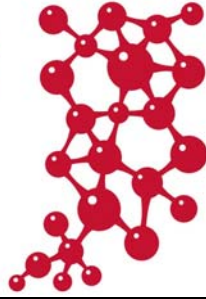

Looking Ahead in Devices: The path ahead for the medical device industry is foggy at best. Major challenges facing the industry this year include repeal of the 2.3% tax on device manufacturers, renewing the Medical Device User Fees Act (MDUFA), FDA reform, and changes to the 510(k) approval process.

Looking Ahead in Pharma/Biotech: The Pharmaceutical and Biotechnology sectors also face a number of important policy decisions: repeal of the Independent Payment Advisory Board (IPAB), passage of a clean Prescription Drug User Fees Act (PDUFA), and important changes to the FDA to spur innovation and reduce costs, are all on the national agenda.

Looking Ahead in Healthcare Delivery: Hospitals and care delivery have been at the center of the national debate on healthcare reform. This panel will discuss some of the most imminent challenges and how Indiana's hospitals are rising to meet them.
